Cannon Industries, the industrial division of Hillcroft Services, employs approximately 350 adults to produce subcontracted work for businesses in East Central Indiana. We currently have a workshop in Franklin and New Castle, Indiana in addition to (3) facilities in Muncie. Our work services programs are designed to provide short- or long-term employment training in a work setting to develop work skills that maximize economic independence. This unique program offers adults with disabilities the opportunity to work full-time, earn a pay check and feel valuable as a member of the labor force. In addition to that, individuals are taught concepts such as compliance, attendance, task completion, problem solving and safety.
